We're Back with our Annual Christmas Party

Join Nordkap's Nature Hike at Kensington Metropark Nov 20th

Come join Nordkap Lodge members and friends on Saturday, Nov. 20th, at 9 a.m. to do some hiking at Kensington Metropark, a 4,481-acre wonderland.

We will meet at the Nature Center parking lot located inside the park. There are signs inside the park directing you to the Nature Center or ask at the entrance booths for directions. A number of trails can be accessed from this

parking lot – up to 7 miles of them. Most are very well-groomed, wandering thru various sections including forests, wetlands, and lakes.

If you like bird watching, this is a great place to spot them. Bring your camera and binoculars. I do suggest hiking boots or good tennis shoes as most paths we will be on are dirt, so they could be muddy in spots, depending on the weather.

Bring your own water, as all drinking fountains are turned off. The Nature Center building is open from 10 a.m. -5 p.m. Bathrooms are open during park hours (6 a.m. -10 p.m.).

Please note that there is a fee to enter Kensington Metropark. If you have a 2021 Metropark pass, it is included in your membership. If not, a single day pass is \$10 per vehicle.

Nordkap Supports the Sons of Norway Foundation

Finnish Center Adopts Restrictive Covid Mandates Affecting Scandinavian Market; Nordkap Drops Plans to Participate

The Finnish Center will hold its Scandinavian Market on November 13 but will restrict attendance to people who have had a covid vaccination and are wearing a face mask.

The policy makes exceptions for children under the age of 15 and those who have a documented medical or religious exception.

The policy reads as follows:

"The Finnish Center asks that all indoor visitors to the Finnish Center (including all members) be vaccinated and to wear face masks. This request does not apply to children under the age of 15 or those individuals that have a documented religious or medical exception.

To show proof of vaccination, we ask that all visitors (i) show their CDC vaccination card OR (ii) sign a statement attesting to their vaccination status. Individuals that do not have a vaccination card and that refuse to sign the statement will not be allowed indoors."

This mandate was not included in earlier publicity distributed by the Finnish Center about the Market. It is reasonable to expect that many visitors arriving at the market will react negatively to not have been made aware in advance that they needed proof of vaccination to be admitted.

Nordkap had been planning to sell import items and waffles at the market, but with the new covid restrictions and their likely effect in reducing attendance and possibly causing ill will, the lodge decided it was not in our best interests to participate.

The event--without Nordkap--is planned to run from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, November 13th, at the Finnish Center at 35200 Eight Mile Rd, Farmington Hills, Michigan. A \$2 donation for the Finnish Center will be requested at the door.

The following should help explain how Sons of Norway is structured, what a zone is, and how attending a zone meeting could members in our lodge connect to other Sons of Norway members in our area:

The International Sons of Norway has eight geographical districts. Our district, District Five—in the Central United States—is comprised of 45 active lodges in Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Tennessee. The 45 lodges in our district are divided into six zones. Each zone has one or more zone directors who are members of the District's Board of Directors. The zone directors serve as special resources, offering guidance and special help to the lodges assigned to them.

Nordkap is one of 12 lodges in Zone 6. Andy Johnson is the zone director for our lodge and five other lodges. Dee Bumpers is the zone director for the other six lodges in our zone.

The lodges under Andy's leadership are Askeladden 610 in Kalamazoo, MI: Christian Radich 568 in Suttons Bay, MI; Nordkap 378 in Farmington Hills, MI; Scandiana 600 (Andy's lodge) in Chesterton, IN; Sognefjord 523 in Muskegon, MI; and Sonja Henie 490 in Lansing, MI.

The lodges assigned to Dee are Arctic Circle 662 in Akron, OH; Circle City 614 in Carmel, IN (near Indianapolis); Edvard Grieg 657 in Cincinnati, OH; Music City Vikings 681 in Nashville, TN; Shawnee Skogen 689 in Carbondale, IL (in Southern Illinois); and Vikings of the Smokies 677 in Knoxville, TN (Dee's lodge).
